## Shape Homework Years 3 and 4.

## This week we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes. Draw each of these shapes into your homework books. Remember to label the shape you have drawn and use a ruler to be accurate.

- 1. Draw a shape that has 4 equal sides.
- 2. Draw a shape that has 3 equal sides.
- 3. Draw a shape that has four corners.
- 4. Draw a shape that has no corners.
- 5. Draw a shape that has five sides.
- 6. Draw a shape that has six corners.
- 7. Draw a shape that has three corners.
- 8. Draw a shape that has one face.
- 9. Draw a pattern using 4 squares and 4 triangles. Count all the corners.
- 10. Draw a pattern using 2 squares, 2 triangles and two circles. Count all the corners.

## Extension tasks:
