Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers

It was so lovely to see everyone back in school. It has been an extremely positive start to the term, which has been helped by the fantastic sunny days. The children seem very settled, if a little hot and sweaty.

Just a quick remainder on uniform; although we appreciate it is very hot at the moment the uniform for girls is a skirt, yellow gingham dress or loose shorts which end just above the knee. Girls are welcome to wear cycling shorts for PE, however, when they are in uniform cycling shorts must only be worn under a skirt and not, for modesty reasons, on their own.

Orchard Vale's uniform is navy blue and yellow (not grey and white). White t-shirts are permissible for PE. Children should wear sensible, black shoes which support their foot, trainer type shoes are permitted as long as they are **black**.

- Navy skirt, pinafore, culottes style is your choice – smart and practical.
- Yellow polo shirt
- School sweatshirt or navy jumper/ cardigan - this can be the school logo or plain.
- Dark practical shoes (no high heels)

- Smart navy trousers
- · Yellow polo shirt
- School sweatshirt or navy jumper/cardigan - this can be the school logo or plain.
- Dark practical shoes.

With the hot weather please could you ensure you send in plenty of drinks, water refills are available in school but children will need their own labelled drinks bottle, apply suncream before leaving home and send in a sunhat. If children are able to apply suncream you can provide them with some to apply themselves through the day but this should not be shared for allergy reasons.

Class teachers will be sending home more information over the next few days via email and Teams.

Thank you for your support in ensuring the return to school goes as smoothly as possible.

Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC)

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in education settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its longterm

durability. Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach and as a result areas in affected spaces will be vacated.

The DfE has been helping education settings and responsible bodies (such as local authorities and multi-academy trusts) to identify and manage the potential risks of RAAC since 2018. You can find more in the Education Hub article published by DfE.

We appreciate the concern this may raise, and we will always prioritise the safety of your children and our staff.

We do not have any confirmed RAAC in our buildings and have not been asked to close any areas. However, we want to take care and to be sure, and are currently working with the DfE to actively check whether RAAC has been used in the construction of any part of our buildings. If RAAC is identified, we will let you know straight away.

The change in guidance is precautionary in nature, and only affects education premises where the presence of RAAC has been confirmed. DfE is offering us access to surveyors who are helping us do these checks quickly.

If we need to put them in place, contingency plans will prioritise the continuation of education and ensure that, if RAAC is identified, any impact on students is kept to an absolute minimum. Rest assured that the safety of students and staff is of paramount importance to all concerned.

Price Changes as from 1st September 2023

We need to inform all parents that, after careful consideration, we are having to increase the cost of:

Breakfast Club - £3.50 per child/per day (£3 for siblings)

After School Club – OV Explorers - £7 per child/per day

School meals - the cost of a meal will be £2.50.

This decision has not been taken lightly, but with the significantly higher costs we are now facing for our gas and electric, along with the food and non-food inflationary costs increasing by over 12%, we are now at the point where we need to reflect these in our price costs.

We fully understand how difficult times are, therefore, we have tried to keep the increase as small as possible. As a nation we are all hoping that food and utility costs stabilise or potentially drop in the months ahead but as a precaution we will be undertaking a further review of meal prices in spring 2024.

The Government has continued to support the Universal Infant Free School Meals project, and this means that all the children, from Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 can be provided with a school meal free of charge.

If your child is in Years 3-6, they can also have a free school meal if you are in receipt of certain allowances. Please contact the school office for information or help in completing forms.

If there is a difficulty in providing payment for meals, please contact the school office as soon as possible. All queries and requests for support are confidential and we will always work with families to ensure find the best solution we can.

Nursery and Little Seeds fees remain the same.




