
Fire Safety Assembly



The Year 2 and 5 children took part in a Staying Safe presentation by the Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Service. They learned about the role of the Fire Service, how to identify hot and cold items, the danger of matches, lighters and candles, how to make an emergency 999 call and the consequences of hoax calls. The children were able to talk about planning a safe escape route from their home in case of fire, the importance of smoke alarms and how to adopt the stop, drop and roll method if clothing becomes involved in fire.


