Water bottles / suncream / sunhat

After School Club—Autumn 2021

Looking ahead to the Autumn Term we are assessing the need for an after school facility along the lines of our Breakfast Club. Initially we would like to know the demand for this provision from parents so we can assess the viability.

If your child is in Reception - Year 6 we would like to know if you would benefit from after school wrap around care that would operate Monday to Friday until 17:00/17:30 operating until the end of the Autumn Term.

The charge for this provision will be approximately £6 per child. Once we have an idea of numbers we will confirm the costing and availability. There could be the chance of offering an early pick up reduction and there will be a late pick up charge applied.




The Adventurers nomination


