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Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers

We hope you all had a lovely Easter break and managed to get out and about in the gorgeous weather we had. It has been wonderful hearing from the children about their trips out to the park, beach, swimming pool, visiting relatives with some venturing further afield, having fun in the garden and seeing friends and family. Living with Covid

From Friday, 1st April the government rules for Covid were relaxed.



If your child is unwell and has a high temperature they should stay at home.

They can return to school when they feel well enough and the fever has gone.



If you choose to or have been requested to take a Lateral Flow Device or PCR test and the result is positive, please inform the school office in the usual way.

If you test positive the advice from the government is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days (for adults) and three days (for under 18 year olds), which is when they are most infectious.

You can pay for Lateral Flow Tests at some local pharmacists.
