Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers

This week I have had the privilege to work alongside the Year 6 children as they completed their statutory tests. I was extremely proud of the way they all conducted themselves. They quietly and diligently worked their way through each of the papers and tried extremely hard. We could not have asked more from them.

I know that other children in school are working hard in preparation for their statutory assessment. Year 1 will be completing their phonics screening check next month; Year 4 children will be completing their multiplication check; Year 2 children will be completing their maths and English tests as part of their normal classwork. Please rest assured that children are extremely well prepared for this and they will be supported throughout by their teachers.

On Monday and Tuesday the children in Key Stage One all took part in a day of daring activities at Rock and Rapid Adventure as part of their summer topic "Mighty Mountains". They all stepped up to the challenge of climbing, bouldering, archery, high ropes or low ropes. We saw so many children conquering their fears and having a go. It was lovely to see their confidence soar as they met each challenge.

We have a few staffing changes this term with Mrs Lowrey working alongside our partner schools in Northam. We are delighted to appoint Miss Gulliford as acting Deputy Headteacher for this term. Although this means she will now be working out of the classroom she will still oversee the teaching and learning for her class. She will be supported by Mr Platt, who will be teaching the children in her class on most days. I am sure you will make him feel extremely welcome. Miss Porter will be starting her maternity leave after half-term and Mr Boult will be covering her post as SENDCo during this time. He will remain in class for now and we will soon be appointing his replacement.



Devon County Council's Free School Meals holiday voucher scheme –May half-term 2022

About the scheme

Devon County Council is supporting families of children who currently receive free school meals during term time with supermarket vouchers to help buy food during the May half-term.

You should receive £15 for each child for the May half-term. These vouchers can be used at the following stores: Sainsburys, Iceland, Farmfoods, Tesco, Morrison's, Asda, Aldi, M&S Food and Waitrose to purchase food over the May half-term to replace the meals your child would have received at school during the day. Please note that Tesco/Morrisons/ALDI vouchers can only be used in-store.

If you have more than one child entitled to free school meals, you should receive a unique code for each child, as the holiday vouchers are issued separately.

Please note that these codes expire on Friday 5th August 2022. Once this date has passed, the scheme will expire, and we will not be backdating any payments.

Getting the vouchers

Devon County Council has partnered with an organisation called Black Hawk Network to help us distribute these vouchers as quickly as possible via their 'Select' website because they have lots of experience managing voucher schemes like this and are working with several other local authorities too.

- To get your vouchers you will need to visit a website called 'Select' (www.select-your-reward.co.uk) and input your unique code.
- You will then be able to choose your preferred supermarket and add your vouchers to your basket.
- Please then checkout of the 'Select' website by providing an email address for them to send you your chosen supermarket vouchers electronically. There is no option to receive physical vouchers by post.
- Once you have received the vouchers to your email inbox, you can save them to your phone or tablet to
 use online (depending on the supermarket) or show at the checkout in store. Alternatively, you can print
 the vouchers off to give to the cashier.

What if I need some help?

If you are struggling to get your vouchers because you don't have access to the internet or a mobile device to receive and store the vouchers on, and don't have any friends or family to help, please contact Devon County Council's education helpline on 0345 155 1019.

Further information

If your child has siblings attending school in a neighbouring authority (for example Plymouth or Torbay) who are also receiving free school meals, the local authority their school is located within will have arrangements to support them over the holidays.

If you received a voucher code for the Easter break and haven't used it to get your supermarket vouchers via Black Hawk's 'Select' website yet, please do so by Wednesday 22nd June 2022. Once this date has passed, the scheme will expire, and we will not be backdating any payments.

More detailed information about the free school meals holiday voucher scheme, including how to use them and what to do if there's a problem, is available on Devon County Council's website. Living with Covid

From Friday, 1st April the government rules for Covid were relaxed.



If your child is unwell and has a high temperature they should stay at home.

They can return to school when they feel well enough and the fever has gone.



If you choose to or have been requested to take a Lateral Flow Device or PCR test and the result is positive, please inform the school office in the usual way.

If you test positive the advice from the government is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days (for adults) and three days (for under 18 year olds), which is when they are most infectious.

You can pay for Lateral Flow Tests at some local pharmacists.
