All pupils will return to school on Wednesday, 6th September 2023.

Morning drop-off arrangements

Parents and children are to enter the school playground through the emergency gates.

The playground gates will open at 8:30am and will remain open until 8:50am.

Members of staff will be on the playground to direct your child to their new class. For safeguarding reasons, parents are asked to refrain from entering the school building either through the office entrance or through the playground.

Registration is at 8:50am; children arriving after this time will be recorded as 'late' or 'late after register closes' if they arrive after 9:15am. If you arrive late and the school gates are locked, you will need to sign your child in via the school office.

End of the day collection

When collecting your child at the end of the day we will ask parents to wait on the playground and your child will be brought to you by the staff members in their class.

Children will be released at the following times:

3:20pm – Reception, Year 1 and 2 3:25pm – Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 3:30pm – Nursery

Please arrive promptly at the allocated time, as children will need to wait on the playground until collected. Once you have collected your child/children please leave promptly by the exit next to the cabin allowing space for other parents to collect.

I really do appreciate your help and support in making the beginning and end of the school day such a positive time. It is always very busy, and your patience is greatly appreciated.

Price Changes as from 1st September 2023

We need to inform all parents that, after careful consideration, we are having to increase the cost of:

Breakfast Club - £3.50 per child/per day (£3 for siblings) After School Club – OV Explorers - £7 per child/per day School meals - the cost of a meal will be £2.50.

This decision has not been taken lightly, but with the significantly higher costs we are now facing for our gas and electric, along with the food and non-food inflationary costs increasing by over 12%, we are now at the point where we need to reflect these in our price costs.

We fully understand how difficult times are, therefore, we have tried to keep the increase as small as possible. As a nation we are all hoping that food and utility costs stabilise or potentially drop in the months ahead but as a precaution we will be undertaking a further review of meal prices in spring 2024.

The Government has continued to support the Universal Infant Free School Meals project, and this means that all the children, from Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 can be provided with a school meal free of charge.

If your child is in Years 3-6, they can also have a free school meal if you are in receipt of certain allowances. Please contact the school office for information or help in completing forms.

If there is a difficulty in providing payment for meals, please contact the school office as soon as possible. All queries and requests for support are confidential and we will always work with families to ensure find the best solution we can.

Nursery and Little Seeds fees remain the same.

Settling ParentPay debt

Please could we ask parents/guardians to settle any outstanding ParentPay debts by the end of next week:

School dinners Breakfast Club/Breakfast Club Siblings Explorers After School Club Late pick up charges Little Seeds and Nursery fees.

This is especially important for parents/guardians of Years 6 leavers.

In the event of a built up of debt you may be refused access to some of these services.

Pupils hold crazy hair day to support Orchard Vale's Sue—article in the North Devon Journal

Pupils at a Barnstaple primary school have held a 'Crazy Hair Day' fundraiser in support of a long-standing member of staff who lost her hair while being treated for cancer.

Sue Manley has worked at Orchard Vale Community School since it opened in 1991 and was diagnosed with endometrial cancer in November last year. The school project co-ordinator has undergone chemotherapy at North Devon District Hospital, following a hysterectomy and radiotherapy at the Royal Devon and Exeter Hospital.

Sue, 63, returned to work last month and visited each class at the Whiddon Valley school to explain to the children why she had no hair.

"I wanted to let the children know that the medication to make me well had resulted in me losing my hair for a while," she said. "They were all so lovely and decided to hold a crazy hair day to support me and raise some money for the school PTA and for the Over and Above Fern Centre, which has been helping me during my cancer treatment.

"There were some fantastically creative hairstyles; one child had a farm yard on his head and another had a bottle with their hair coming out like water. One of the children had a message on their hair saying 'you've got this Mrs Manley?."

PE teacher Mr Ovey shaved his hair off in support after pledging to pupils that he'd brave the shave if they could raise more than \pounds 1,000.

On Thursday, Sue visited the Fern Centre with some of the staff and pupils to present a cheque for £1,243.70. Pupils were given a tour of the cancer and wellbeing centre, which is funded by the Over and Above hospital charity.

Kate Constable, community fundraiser for Over and Above, said: "It was wonderful to hear about how the staff and pupils at Orchard Vale have been supporting Sue and very special to be able to welcome them to the Fern Centre to learn more about how it supports cancer patients and their families in North Devon.

"The money the school has raised will help ensure the centre can continue to offer a whole range of free information, complementary therapies, counselling and support for local people at the time they need it most.


