## Parking and road use around Orchard Vale

Please could we ask for your co-operation in making children's journey to and from school as safe as possible. Careful driving is essential, especially during the busy drop off and collection times.

Unless you hold a blue badge, please could you park your car on either side of the road after the school (just after Kingfisher Drive) or in one of the local residential roads. Please be mindful of blocking residential driveways or restricting access for other road users.

If you are a blue badge holder, there are 2 marked places on the right hand side of our car park and you are able to park for a short time on the turning circle.

If you are not a blue badge holder but wish to drop a child off please could you use the space available sensibly and exercise some patience and caution with pedestrians and other drivers, moving on as soon as possible.

It is important to acknowledge that pedestrians have the right of way on footpaths. Should a car mount the kerb or drive at speed this may be considered a driving offence in the eyes of the law. We are sure you would all agree that driving without due care and attention could cause devastation should any harm come to someone.

### Years 5 and 6 week:


It is lovely to welcome Mrs Rana back into class following her maternity leave, the children were so pleased to see her.
