PHASED REOPENING OF SCHOOLS

Many families will have heard the Prime Minister's address on Sunday, 11th May in which he stated that:

"At the earliest by June 1 – after half term – we believe we may be in a position to begin the phased reopening of shops and to get primary pupils back into schools, in stages, beginning with reception, Year 1 and Year 6. Our ambition is that secondary pupils facing exams next year will get at least some time with their teachers before the holidays."

Currently, Orchard Vale Community School will continue to offer places for vulnerable children and those of key workers.

We understand that many other parents will want to know more about when their children will return to school. Schools across the country will also have heard this news for the first time on Sunday and over the course of the next week or two, we will be reviewing the detailed guidance government has said it will provide. We will then take any action required to open the school to the year groups Identified in a safe way.

When we are in a position to do so, we will provide information on our website, via email and in our newsletter so that parents will know exactly when the school will be able to once again offer a place for their children.

In the meantime, it would be appreciated if parents could avoid contacting the school directly on this matter.

If you choose to sing, please look at the lyrics and sing the verse for your year groups or the chorus – that way the clip will be small enough to email.

Parents you can record your child on a mobile phone camera, an iPad or any other device.

Please <u>mark clearly in the subject box</u> the following: <u>Just Sing project (KS...)</u> (insert the Key Stage your child is in eg Foundation, Key Stage One or Key Stage Two)

Listen to the song as much as you can, practise as much as you can... then just go for it!! Be brave be confident.





Michael made a delicious carrot biryani. Naima cooked a vegetable soup. Gracie made a smoothie.
















Chloe-Rose made a kimono shaped book with information about Japan. Ruby found out about Shibuya Ohara Matsuri, a dance festival, which takes

Boots pharmacies offering safe spaces for victims of domestic abuse

Boots chemists are offering safe spaces within their pharmacies for victims of domestic abuse.



Anyone needing help can ask staff at the counter to use the consultation room, where they will be able to contact local services for help and advice. It's been launched by charity, Hestia, following an increase in calls to domestic violence helplines, since lockdown.

Devon's regional domestic violence and abuse support charity, Splitz, saw a 62 per cent rise in the number of reports to them during April.
