#### **Attendance**

Further to my comments last week and following the pandemic we have been developing a plan to support pupil's learning and as such are preparing for 2022-23 and would like to confirm our attendance requirement.

We are committed to maximising the educational opportunities and achievements for every child. In order for them to gain the best education during their time at Orchard Vale, it is vital that they achieve excellent attendance and punctuality. We strive for 100% attendance for all children but we do understand that pupils can be genuinely ill and absent for other justifiable reasons, such as long term health issues or supporting their family due to bereavement.

With your support we can priorities children's attendance to help with the catch up process, expecting pupils to achieve an attendance mark of 95%.

Requests for pupil absence for holidays in term time will only be granted in **exceptional** circumstances such as armed forces leave. We will refer cases to the Local Authority if parents take unauthorised absence such as holidays and this could result in fines. We would, of course, prefer not to do this and ask parents to work with us to prioritise their child's attendance.

Well done to everyone, especially those who can now swim 25 M.


#### RECEPTION DINOSAUR EXPEDITION

We ended the day on the train and tried not to get wet. Followed by lots of fun in the soft play and an amazing sea lion show.










#### Celebrating home learning in Year 5

## Spot Light on the Commonwealth Games

**The multi sporting competition is held every four years**, with a hiatus during World War II, the Games have grown from featuring 11 countries and 400 athletes, to a global spectacle of 6,600 sports men and women from across 72 nations and territories. They will be held in Birmingham from Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> July to Monday 8<sup>th</sup> August.

We would like to encourage you to talk to your children about the importance of sport which keeps us fit and healthy and is also good for our mental health.

### Spotlight on Beach Volleyball



Teams of two will go head to head on the sand beginning each rally by serving the ball over the net which will see the ball hit a maximum of three times on one side before being directed back across the net. This back and forth across the net continues until one team wins the rally. Teams win a rally if the opponent fails to return the ball, commits a fault, or if the ball lands in the opponent's court. The team who wins the rally wins a point and will serve next.

Matches are a best of three sets with the first two sets played to 21 points and the third set (If necessary) played to 15 points. A set is won by the first team to reach 21 points (or 15 points) with at least a two-point advantage. In the event that the score is 20-20

(or 15-15), play continues until a team earns a two-point advantage with no limit on the final score of a set.














# Living with Covid

#### **Increasing Covid-19 cases**

Cases of Covid-19 are increasing in the community. The guidance remains that anyone with symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as Covid-19 and has a high temperature or feeling unwell should try to stay at home and avoid contact with others.

Children with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to come to school.



Children who are unwell and have a <u>high</u> <u>temperature</u> should stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people.



#### **Covid Testing**

Although testing is no longer expected. If a child has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and where possible avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.

The risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower after 3 days.

Children can return to school when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough.

If a member of family has tested positive for COVID-19 children can continue to attend school.
