### Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers

This week we have started the countdown to Christmas. With the cold, dark nights creeping in it is definitely giving us something to look forward to. The children have started to prepare for their performances and are extremely excited to share these with you. Details of performances and how to book seats will be shared via your child's Teams account for Key Stage Two and a letter will be coming home from Reception/Key Stage One teachers. It is that time of year when we have noticed an increase in absence due to sickness. In school, children are encouraged to maintain good hygiene and we strive to keep our school a safe and healthy environment. We kindly ask you to support your children with:

**Handwashing:** Encourage frequent handwashing with soap and water, especially before meals and after using the bathroom.

**Covering Coughs and Sneezes:** Teach children to cover their mouth and nose with a tissue or their elbow when they cough or sneeze.

**Avoiding Face Touching:** Remind children to avoid touching their face, especially their eyes, nose, and mouth, to prevent the spread of germs.

**Staying Home When Sick:** If your child is not well enough to come to school, please keep them at home to rest and recover fully before returning to school.

**Personal Items:** Ensure children do not share personal items like water bottles, utensils, or towels.

Our Reception Starters for September 2025 open evenings were very successful. It was lovely to meet new families and to share our wonderful school with them. If you know of any families who are yet to apply for a reception place, please let them know we are still accepting applications and will be holding 2 more open evenings in January. More information will follow.

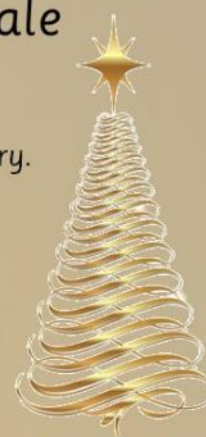
