Nursery this week:

This week we have been learning about ourselves and have been drawing self-portraits. In maths, we have been learning about 2D shapes. We have made 2D shapes with playdough and used shapes to make faces. We have also been reading 'The Ugly Duckling' and 'Elmer' and talking about how we are all different. Our songs this week have been 'Head, shoulders knees and toes,' and 'We are special. 'We have also had a lovely week welcoming our all new children. Have a wonderful weekend.

Reception/Miss Cawthorne—Year 1's week:

We have been learning about The Cautious Caterpillar story, looking at the life cycle of the butterfly and have been busy creating patterns on butterfly wings. In maths, the children have been looking at recognising numerals from 1 to 10.

In Phonics we have looked at **satp**. It would be helpful if you could practice these at home with your child; you could find things around the house which begin with these sounds and record what you find in your home link books. For the sounds and actions for all of our letters click on the hyperlink on our website (Parent Information/Reception).

Year 1- It has been lovely having our Year 1's as part of Miss Cawthorne's class. In English, we have written about the life cycle of the butterfly and about what the characters might say to each other in the story. In Maths, we have concentrated on addition. For homework this week you could practice adding numbers to 10 e.g. 10 + 3 = and record them in your home link books.

Our book next week is The Little Red Hen.

Key Stage One's week:

What a busy first full week we have had, the children have settled in beautifuly and have thrown themselves into learning.

In English we have focussed on the story of Monkey Puzzle. We have been writing sentences using capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. We have been writing our aspirations ready for display.

In maths, we have been exploring numbers in a variety of ways, sorting objects and thinking about the different ways we can represent numbers.

During our topic session we began looking at different layers of a rainforest and looking into the different animals that live in each layer. We really enjoyed finding out facts about the red eyed tree frog.


Years 5 and 6 week:

We have put lots of helpful knowledge organisers (science, vocabulary, Elizabethans) onto Seesaw the online homework and information portal for Years 5 and 6. Knowledge organisers help children learn key facts and a wide range of knowledge to prepare them for lessons and the wider world. To get the most out of knowledge organisers, your child should be learning sections and then quiz themselves. Low stakes quizzing aids retrieval and using memorised facts, alongside knowledge organisers, can help acquisition and storage of facts. It helps to embed learning in the memory.
