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### **School Improvements**

We are currently looking into expanding the key stage 1 provision first trying to get staffing in place.

We have appointed a new teacher for September who is currently training with us. Thoughts around classes have are already in place and what groupings may be for next year.

The spaces around the classroom has been looked at and some changes are planned for the summer holidays to make it a workable space.

Staff are really excited about the changes and the opportunities this will bring next year.

New management suite now ready for use, what is planned, next steps for the building?

We have already got several training courses book in for this term and the large function room will be a fully working space for us once the kitchen is in.

It will be advertised as a training room and offered to the local community.

It is currently being used for a variety of meetings such as PAT moderation, executive teams, parents and as the meeting room is secure it is ideal for safeguarding and multiagency meetings.

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## **Swimming**

 Do we know what percentage of the children can swim? Also are there any who do not have experience of family visits to the beach. It is a wonderful resource but I suspect there are families who do not go. Nintendo's and TV may take precedence.

We are unable to control or determine what happens in the lives of children outside of school hours.

We have a record of children in years 3,4,5,6 and their swimming ability.

Children are offered swimming lessons in years 3,4,5,6 but it is their parents decision if they pay for them, they are supported a little by sports premium money.

The beach is a great resource and we hope parents take their children.

We offer trips to the beach usually to the younger children, reception years 1 and 2 all went last year, this can be a costly trip as transport is expensive.

Our children have fantastic outdoor curriculum offered to them through forest school, trips and walks, sporting activities, and residential that often include beach trips.

Thrive groups and grandparent's groups have arranged trips to the beach too.
