SCIL offers a two-year Foundation Degree in either Teaching and Learning or Early Years to Adolescence (a sector endorsed EY course) in Partnership with the University of Worcester. These programmes have been developed specifically for those working or volunteering with children, to enhance skills and expertise whilst continuing to practice.

All students who achieve their Foundation Degree have an opportunity, which will involve an extra year of study, to top up to a full BA Hons Degree. All students who obtain a degree are eligible to apply for a 1-year teacher training qualification with SCIL on our outstanding schools Initial Teacher Training Programme.

Study for a Foundation Degree in Learning and Development from Early Years to Adolescences (0-19) with Somerset Centre for Integrated Learning and the University of Worcester

Study in Somerset and continue working

SCIL is offering a two-year Foundation Degree in Learning and Development from Early Years to Adolescence (0-19), this programme is designed for those who wish to gain a higher-level academic practice based qualification in working with children and young people (0-19). It is ideal for those working in; children's social care, the Children and Young Peoples Workforce, early years, play work, or as a childminder and maybe topped up to a full degree by completing the BA Hons.

Taught Sessions

The taught element of the course will take place at the SCIL Training Centre. There will be occasional Saturday sessions and a one day conference.

Employment/Volunteering

This full time Foundation Degree requires you to attend taught sessions once a week during term time. The degree is work based and designed so that students can work alongside their studies. You must be working or volunteering in a relevant setting for a minimum of 10 hours a week.

Supporting your studies

A personal academic tutor will support and guide you through your studies. You will be offered to access a range of Summer School sessions prior to September, such as study skills and developing your own learning style to support your academic learning.

You will also be able to access University of Worcester's online resources, and SCIL have a range of resources managed by an Academic Library Assistant dedicated to supporting Higher Education students.

Early Years Ratios

This Foundation Degree has been recognised as meeting the Early Years Educator (EYE) criteria and is classed 'full and relevant' and on the Early Years Qualifications List (Post-September 2014) from September 2018. https://www.gov.uk/guidance/early-years-qualifications-finder#qualifications-started-after-1-september-2014

How am I assessed?

The programme provides opportunities to develop understanding and learning through the completion of assignments. Assessment methods include essay, reflective evaluation, portfolio, project and case study. Submissions are spread throughout the academic year.

What will you study

The first year of the Foundation Degree is at Level 4 and the second is Level 5. You will study a range of modules in your first year:

- Introduction to Study Skills
- Reflective Journal
- Safeguarding and Well-being of Children and Young People
- Introduction to the Development of Children and Young People
- Enabling Environments: Characteristics of Effective Learning and Development

Entry requirements

Mature students (over 21 years)

If you do not have any formal qualifications a non-standard entry route is available. Under 21 years

Passes in grade C/4 and above in four GCSE subjects plus one A level at grade C or equivalent points (e.g. 2 AS levels at grade D)

All successful applications will be invited to an enrolment day prior to the start of the course. This gives you an opportunity to meet tutors, other students and find out more about the programme.

Course Fees

The standard tuition fee for this full-time Foundation Degree is £9,250, for 2019/20. You may be able to apply for a student loan for the full cost of the course as well as a maintenance loan, which you are not required to start repaying until you earn over £25,000.
