#### **Early Bird Breakfast Club**

Our Early Bird Breakfast Club runs from 7:30am – 8:30am Monday to Friday during school term time for children in Reception to Year 6.

To use this facility you must initially register your child with the School Office. Please contact us on 01271 375074 or email orchardvale@ventrus.org.uk for more information.

Payment is required in advance and paid through Parentpay at a cost of £3 per child, per day(£2 charge for subsequent siblings per day).

#### **School Lunches**

Liz and her team offer wonderful school dinners every day. The options are main, vegetarian, jacket potato and school packed lunch (see the copy of the menu on our website or at the end of this newsletter).

For children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 school dinners can be purchased in advance for £2.30 via our online payment system, ParentPay.

Parents of Year 3 children and children moving from Little Seeds to Nursery - please note that unless you are registered under the Government Benefit Related Free School Meals system you will now need to pay for lunches.

#### Universal free school meals

All children in Reception, years 1 and 2 are entitled to book a school dinner which will be paid for by the Government under the Universal Free School Meal scheme.

#### Benefit related free school meals

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. However, parents and guardians are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school, as this can help their child's school to attract additional 'pupil premium' funding to support learning.

If your child is in Years 3,4,5 or 6, and parents are getting any of the following you may be entitled to free school meals:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

- Income Support (IS).
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA).
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190).
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment you get for a further 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit).




#### Mrs Youll's nomination

## Government Guidance for school attendance during Covid-19

It is lovely to welcome everyone back to school under the new, more relaxed guidelines from the Government.

At Orchard Vale we will continue with good hygiene measures for everyone, maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes, keeping occupied spaces well ventilated and making use of appropriate PPE.

#### Symptoms of Covid-19

New continuous cough and/or high temperature and/or a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

#### Isolation

Unless children exhibit symptoms they will not be required to isolate at home.

Children may still come into school even if a member of the household has a positive PCR result/Covid-19 symptoms, as long as the child does not have symptoms themselves. If you choose to keep your child off school we are currently required to register their absence as unauthorised.

If your child is showing any of the symptoms of Covid-19 you should contact 119 and ask for guidance, you will be asked to keep your child at home. You may be required to book a PCR test for them and keep them at home until the results are received.

If a child exhibits symptoms whilst in class we will isolate them, call parents and request you to collect them as soon as possible, book a PCR test and advise us when you receive the results.

In the event of a positive result you will be instructed by Public Health England to isolate your child for 10 days from the onset of symptoms.

#### **PCR** test

You will need to take advice from the NHS on 119 if you think your child requires a PCR test.

If you do not have symptoms but have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive through a PCR test OR if you have been contacted through Track and Trace and advised to, you may book a PCR test. As long as you are not exhibiting any symptoms of Covid-19 you may still come into school until the results of the test have been received.

You should not arrange for a PCR test if you have received a positive PCR test result in the last 90 days, unless you develop any new symptoms of Covid-19, as it is possible for PCR tests to remain positive for some time after Covid-19 infection.

#### **Staff Lateral Flow Testing**

All staff are required to take 2 Lateral Flow Tests per week and report the results to the Headteacher until the end of September, when this will be reviewed by the Government.

#### **Bubbles**

Classes are now back to normal, with children being able to mix, attend assembly etc.

Should there be a positive case within a classroom we will be advised by Public Health England to bubble that class. All children and staff, with the exception of the child who has a positive PCR test, will be allowed to attend school but will remain within their bubble at all times and will not mix with any other groups for the advised period.

#### Clusters/Outbreaks

We are required to seek advice from Public Health England should there be 5 children/staff who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for Covid-19 within a 10-day period:

Or

10% of children, staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for Covid-19 within a 10-day period.

We will then act upon that advise appropriately.

Please remember to call the School Office before 9am on 01271 375074 if your child is not going to be in school. Please provide their name, class and reason/symptoms for being absent.

In preparation, the children will be designing their own Christmas artwork that you will be able to purchase.


In the next few weeks children will bring home a form with their artwork.

Free fruit and vegetable boxes offer Devon's children a healthy start

The past 18 months have been a struggle, particularly for those families with young children who face financial challenges of being on low incomes. Worrying about money can have a real impact on someone's physical and mental health, and make it difficult for families to eat healthily.

<u>So Devon County Council are encouraging two and a half thousand eligible families in Devon to sign up to receive a seasonal fruit and vegetable box this Autumn as part of an initiative to help raise awareness of the government's Healthy Start scheme, which is due to go digital later this year.</u>

The 'Get a Healthy Start' box contains fresh fruit and vegetables and simple plant-based recipe ideas, with tips on how to swap or add ingredients (including meat and fish) and prevent food waste. The box will also contain free vitamins and information on how to apply and make the most of the Healthy Start scheme.

The Healthy Start scheme provides eligible families who are pregnant or have children under the age of 4 years old, with financial support to spend on cow's milk; fresh, frozen or tinned fruit and vegetables; fresh, dried, and tinned pulses; infant formula, and free vitamins.

Recent research has shown that just under a third of households in Devon with children are experiencing food insecurity, but at the moment, only around half of eligible families are signed up to the scheme, which means many are missing out on much needed support.


