Reception/Miss Cawthorne— Miss Cawthorne's Year 1's week:

We have had a fantastic week learning about 'Panda What Can You See' story. The children painted some lovely pictures of animals using the watercolours. They also had fun acting out the story using animals and making bird feeders at forest school.

Sounds we have learnt this week are **Ck e u r** please practice these at home, along with your teddy word charts.

In Maths, we have continued to look at counting to 20 and recognising and writing the numbers. **For homework** this week you could practice writing your numbers using different resources e.g. chalk, in sand, with paint etc.

Year 1- This week in maths we have looked at missing number patterns to 100, the children have done a great job of recognising numbers to 100. In phonics we have looked at **ch**, **sh**, **th**. For homework this week you could write down any words you can remember with these sounds in.

Key Stage One's week:

In maths, we have been looking at place value and using the greater than, less than and equal to symbols to compare number. In English, we have been spicing up our writing with adjectives and written some stories using language from the text and story mapping 'Augustus and his smile'.

Mrs Oldfield's class had a fantastic geography session travelling all over the world without even leaving the classroom, we went to Brazil, Scotland, Australia and even visited some of our friends houses.

Forest school has been fantastic this week. Mr Quilter's and Mrs Oldfield's classes melted marshmallows on an open fire whilst Mrs Huggins'/Mrs Grimwood's class made charcoal with Mr Magson.

The children's rainforest non-fiction booklets are beginning to take shape!
