## Bonfire Night

The School Council bonfire night was a huge success. Thank you to the staff, parents and Friends of Orchard Vale for working so hard behind the scenes. Thank you to everyone who attended-we hope you had a good time. With your kind donations for the non-uniform day, cake sale and bonfire night the School Council has raised £726.55 and will be planning a whole school treat shortly.


The children in Little Seeds collected toilet rolls to use as tools to make some fantastic firework pictures. They were exploring with colour and made the loud fireworks noises. Our Nursery children used marbles and paint to explore colours and how they can be changed. The children discussed how to stay safe when around bonfires and fireworks.


## Remembrance

A group of Years 5 and 6 children represented Orchard Vale at the Children's Remembrance Service at Rock Park hosted by the Mayor of Barnstaple. Schools across Barnstaple sent representatives to mark the end of World War One in 1918 and to remember those who died in conflict since. There was a short address by Reverend Fletcher followed by the Last Post and school representatives laid wreaths and planted crosses in the flower bed.


Mrs Oldfield's class have been thinking about Remembrance and why we wear Poppies. The children learnt a lot and really enjoyed making their Remembrance posters and silhovettes, discussing the new words and information they have learnt while making them.


## German Measles (Rubella)

A child in school has been diagnosed with German Measles (Rubella).
Symptoms take 14-21 days to develop after exposure to the virus (the incubation period)
Symptoms-a red/pink spotty rash starting behind the ears and spreading to the head, neck and body.
The rash can be difficult to see but the skin may feel rough or bumpy.
Other symptoms may include aching joints, cough, sneezing/runny nose, headaches, sore throat or red eyes. The infectious period starts 7 days before the appearance of the rash and lasts for 5 days after the onset of the rash, after which your child can return to school.
IMPORTANT-the illness is mild in children, however, if a pregnant woman is exposed to the infection, it can have a serious affect on the unborn child. If you think you may have been exposed please consult your doctor for advice.
