Coronavirus Symptoms

If your child has any of the main symptoms of coronavirus please keep them at home, follow the recommended actions and advise the school office by 9am. Main symptoms are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal
- To protect others, do not go to places like a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital if you have any of these symptoms. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus and stay at home until you get your result.
- Call 111 NHS for advice. See page 3 for more information.

Parking around Orchard Vale



Please could we ask for your co-operation in making children's journey to and from school as safe as possible. Careful driving and sensible, safe parking is essential, especially during the busy drop off and collection times.

Unless you hold a blue badge, please could you park your car on either side of the road **after** the school (just after Kingfisher Drive) or in one of the local residential roads. Please be mindful of blocking residential driveways or

restricting access for other road users.

If you are dropping a child off please could you use the space available sensibly and exercise some patience with other drivers by moving on as soon as possible.

It is also important to acknowledge that pedestrians have the right of way on footpaths and careless parking, as seen earlier this week by one of our neighbours (see the photo above) could be considered an offence in the eyes of the law and could put the safety of our children and the wider community at risk.

Thank you for your help in making the roads around Orchard Vale as safe as possible by driving and parking carefully.

Orchard Vale do not have any jurisdiction on the road or with parking issues so if you witness any incidents or dangerously parking please contact the Parking Enforcement team via the website link Devon County Council Roads and Transport.

Key Stage 2 children – Times Tables Rockstars

Uniform

We will put your order together and advise you when you can come in to collect it.

Please could you ensure that all items of uniform are clearly labelled to help your child keep track of it.

If your child is new to the school you should be receiving your Parentpay login details in the next week or so. Please bear with us.

School Lunches

Liz and her team offer wonderful school dinners every day. The options are main, vegetarian, jacket potato and school packed lunch (see the copy of the menu on our website or at the end of this newsletter).

For children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 school dinners can be purchased in advance for £2.30 via our online payment system, ParentPay. Parents of year 3 children please note that unless you are registered under the Government Benefit Related Free School Meals system you will now need to pay for lunches

Universal free school meals

All children in Reception, years 1 and 2 are entitled to book a school dinner which will be paid for by the Government under the Universal Free School Meal scheme.

Benefit related free school meals

All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 at state schools in England automatically get free school meals. However, parents and guardians are encouraged to apply for free school meals when they enrol their child in school, as this can help their child's school to attract additional 'pupil premium' funding to support learning.

If your child is in Years 3,4,5 or 6, and parents are getting any of the following you may be entitled to free school meals:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).
- Income Support (IS).
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA).
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (IRESA).
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190).
- Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment you get for a further 4 weeks after you stop ing for Working Tax Credit).

How to apply for benefit related Free School Meals

If you believe you may be eligible for the benefits related free school meals you can apply online and get an immediate response.

What to do if families are being tested for coronavirus (COVID-19)



If your family are being tested for coronavirus (COVID-19) please contact the school office in the first instance to advise that your child will be absent from school.

Once you have received your test results please contact the school office before sending your child back in to school:

· if someone tests negative, if they feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating.

They could still have another virus though, such as a cold or flu – in which case it is still best to avoid contact with other people until they are better. Other members of their household can stop self-isolating.

· if someone tests positive, they should follow the <u>'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection'</u> and must continue to self-isolate for at least 7 days from the onset of their symptoms and then return to school only if they do not have symptoms other than cough or loss of sense of smell/taste.

This is because a cough or anosmia can last for several weeks once the infection has gone. The 7-day period starts from the day when they first became ill. If they still have a high temperature, they should keep self-isolating until their temperature returns to normal. Other members of their household should continue self-isolating for the full 14 days.

Managing confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19)

Orchard Vale will take swift action when we become aware that someone who has attended school has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19). We will contact the relevant authorities who will also contact Orchard Vale directly if they become aware that someone has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) and attended the school – as identified by NHS Test and Trace.

The relevant authorities will carry out a rapid risk assessment to confirm who has been in close contact with the person during the period that they were infectious, and ensure they are asked to self-isolate.

The relevant authority will work with Orchard Vale in this situation to guide them through the actions they need to take. Based on the advice we received Orchard Vale must send home those people who have been in close contact with the person who has tested positive, advising them to self-isolate for 14 days since they were last in close contact with that person when they were infectious. Close contact means:

- · direct close contacts face to face contact with an infected individual for any length of time, within 1 metre, Including being coughed on, a face to face conversation, or unprotected physical contact (skin-to-skin).
- · proximity contacts extended close contact (within 1-2 metres for more than 15 minutes) with an infected individual
- · travelling in a small vehicle, like a car, with an infected person

The relevant authorities have provided definitive advice on actions to be taken should a child be confirmed as having a positive result.

Household members of any children who are sent home do not need to self-isolate themselves unless the child, young person or staff member who is self-isolating subsequently develops symptoms. If someone in a class or group that has been asked to self-isolate develops symptoms themselves within their 14-day isolation period they should follow <u>'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection</u>. They should get a test, and:

- if the test delivers a negative result, they must remain in isolation for the remainder of the 14-day isolation period. This is because they could still develop the coronavirus (COVID-19) within the remaining days.
- · if the test result is positive, they should inform their setting immediately, and must isolate for at least 10 days from the onset of their symptoms (which could mean the self-isolation ends before or after the original 14-day isolation period). Their household should self-isolate for at least 14 days from when the symptomatic person first had symptoms, following 'stay at home: guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection'
