## Headteacher's message

## Dear Parents/Carers

We have had a super week in school and the children are settling to new routines and getting used to being back in school every day. The weather has been very changeable, and children will need to be prepared for all weathers. Please make sure they have a named waterproof coat in school every day. Please also ensure children's clothing and other items are named; we get a lot of lost property and if named this can be returned quickly.

Dear Parent / Guardian
We are pleased to announce that Orchard Vale has organised a clothes and shoe collection with Bag2School in order to raise funds for our Forest School.

Bag2School is the UK's leading textile recycler and fundraiser working with schools and since its inception in 2001 it has now paid out over $£ 36$ million.

As well as raising vitally needed funds for Orchard Vale, it also helps the environment by helping to divert unwanted textiles away from landfill. A recent DEFRA report has shown that textile collection schemes are helping to reduce the volume of textiles discarded as municipal solid waste. However it is a fact that as a nation we still send 350,000 tonnes of textiles to landfill every year.

By getting involved in our Bag2School collection, you have an opportunity to sort through your cupboards and wardrobes and donate unwanted textiles in the bag provided - this can include adults' and children's clothes, shoes (tied together please), hats, belts, handbags and soft toys, (please refer to http:/lluk,bag2schoolcoml for full details). In addition to raising much needed funds it will also raise awareness amongst the children of the benefits of recycling and reuse.

If you fill the donation bag and still have more then you can use any other bag to donate your items and don't forget to ask grandparents, friends and neighbours to have a sort out as well!

Bag2School will be collecting from Orchard Vale on Thursday $2^{44}$ November. Please bring your bag (or bags!) to the main courtyard behind the trellis before this date and help us have a good collection.

## We need your help to keep our children safe!

We are sure you will all agree that the safety of our children and families is of the utmost importance to us all.
Please could we urge our parents/families to put safety first by parking responsibly during drop-off and pick-up times. Please see photos below provided by people in our community showing parking offense this week.

Where possible you should park in the designated area just past the school after Kingfisher Drive and behind the bollards. If you are unable to park there you are able to park in one of our neighbouring residential roads, but please park considerately and do not block driveways or mount the footpath.

Please could we ask you to report any parking or speeding issues to the Police on the non-emergency number of 101 or email $01 @ d c$.police.uk.

The Highway Code tells us you must not stop or park in the following locations, except when forced to do so by stationary traffic:

1. Near a school entrance.
2. Anywhere that would prevent access for emergency vehicles.
3. On a bus stop, or a taxi rank.
4. Opposite or within 32 feet of a junction, except in an authorised parking bay.
5. Opposite another parked vehicle (if it causes an obstruction).
6. Where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair and mobility vehicle users.
7. In front of an entrance to a property.
8. On a bend.
9. A pedestrian crossing, including the area marked by the zig-zag lines
10. Where you would obstruct a cycle lane.
11. A cycle lane during its period of operation.
12. A cycle track.
