COVID UPDATE

As you are all aware cases of Covid-19 are on the rise locally. Orchard Vale have been very fortunate so far during the pandemic but we are now seeing a few cases. Please rest assured that we are continuing with good hygiene measures for everyone, maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes, keeping occupied spaces well ventilated and making use of appropriate PPE.

In line with Public Health England (PHE) instructions we are not required to operate a track and trace system within the school. We are aware other schools in North Devon have received instructions from PHE and are being guided through the correct procedure to communicate cases with parents. At the moment Orchard Vale is not at this stage but we are vigilant and will pass on information should PHE advise us to do so.

Symptoms of Covid-19

A high temperature

A new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours. A loss or change in sense of smell or taste – they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

What should you do if your child exhibits ANY symptom?

If they show **any** of the main symptoms of Covid-19, even if they are mild:-

Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab and <u>not a Lateral Flow Test</u>) to check if they have Covid-19, as soon as possible.

Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result - they can only leave home to have the test.

Please call the school office by 9.30am advising the reason your child is away from school and let us know once you have received the results.

Virgin Care—Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination

Your child is in **Year R to Year 6** from September 2021 and is therefore eligible for a Free Nasal Childhood Flu Vaccination. The immunisation team will be visiting Orchard Vale on:

Friday, 3rd December 2021.

Flu vaccination is one of the most effective interventions we have to reduce pressure on the health and social care system, which is going to be more important than ever this year. For this reason, it is essential we deliver the vaccine to as many children as possible to protect them and prevent the spread of infection to those most at risk in society.

Considering the above, we are expecting demand to be high and therefore we urge you to follow the below link to consent to your child's vaccination asap. Even if you do not want your child to receive this vaccination, please complete the consent form stating "decline". On this link you will also find answers to your FAQ's and links to the current Public Health England and manufacturers leaflets. We recommend you discuss this vaccination with your child prior to the date of vaccination.

Please note, this field is not mandatory so if you are experiencing problems finding/accessing your child's NHS number then you can leave this blank.

We will be operating a strict policy of closing the consent links and your school's link will close at midnight on the **24th November 2021**. If you miss this deadline, your child(ren) will not be vaccinated at school and you will be offered the opportunity to book them into a community catch up clinic. This also applies if your child is absent or refuses the vaccination at school.

Re:- Admission to Primary School 2022 for children born between 01/09/2017 and 31/08/2018

You will be aware that children born between the dates above are entitled to start full time Primary Education in September 2022 The application facility opens on 15th November 2021 and closes at midnight on 15th January 2022. It is important that parents apply before the closing date, even if they are intending to defer their child's admission until later in the academic year, they must secure a place before that decision need be made. In the past we have included posters/fiyers for you to display in your settings, however, due to the current situation we are no longer producing physical copies of posters, as we are shifting to promote our services online.

The Step by Step Guide is now available for download from the School Admission webpages, http://devon.cc/prospectus We know that most families will apply using the online facility at <u>www.devon.gov.uk/admissionsonline</u>. They should receive a letter from the Admissions Team shortly, providing a Unique Identifying Number which will facilitate that application. It is not essential to have this number to apply and any parent who does not receive a letter may proceed through the screens by first selecting 'NO UID'. We are anxious that no application is delayed beyond the closing date as Schools have limits placed upon them and we must offer places up to the determined number in the first round – no places can be held in reserve for late applicants. Each year there are parents who are disappointed that places at local schools are not available because they did not apply on time. I know you will do your best to support your children's progression to statutory education and to this end would ask that you promote the application facility. The Education Helpline Advisers are on hand to manage queries and will help parents navigate the system if necessary, telephone 0345 155 1019.

May I take this opportunity to thank you for your support in this matter and ask that you continue to raise awareness by looking out for our posts on our social media channels and resharing the content and posters electronically.
