In Maths, we have been looking at addition. The children have picked this up really quickly and have even started writing number sentence independently.

As we start writing we will also be practicing letter formation, we have put a sheet of letters in your child's homework book to practice at home. The rhymes are a great way of getting the children to remember the correct formation for letters.
