It is so lovely to see you all back after the Christmas break and to hear all about the great time you had.

This week we have started our exploration of the solar system and planets during topic work; this was met with great enthusiasm by the children. In maths, we are looking at 2D shapes, comparing them and their properties. In literacy, we have been reading Little Red Riding Hood and discussing alternative endings ready for the children to write their own later in the term.

Firstly, I would like to introduce myself, I'm James Kemp a Club and Community Coach for Devon Cricket.

As part of this I will be responsible for coordinating and delivering coaching activity in schools and community environments within the North Devon region, these opportunities include:
