
#### Mr Whapham's nomination

# Parents to report Lateral Flow Test (LFT) results for pupils at Orchard Vale Community School

From Tuesday, 14 December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 is being introduced.

All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, identified as a close contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not, should take a lateral flow device (LFD) test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating.

Daily testing by close contacts will help to slow the spread of COVID-19.

Daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 will help protect education settings by reducing transmission and will also help keep pupils in face-to-face education.

Once notified by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact, all pupils should

- Take an LFD each day for 7 days
- Report the results through the Online Reporting System at www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result
- Report to the school via the form below. Please report one child per Form.

If they test negative, they can continue to attend school.

#### Devon's Director of Public Health urges us all to bother

As we approach the end of a second year of coronavirus, and in the week that tighter measures are being introduced to tackle a more infectious variant, Steve Brown, Director of Public Health Devon, reflects on where we are:

"It's easy to become despondent, and to think why bother? The vast majority of us have bothered, and have followed the guidance, heeded expert advice, and rolled up our sleeves to receive the vaccinations.

"So, with case rates rising, and a new more infectious strain of the virus now gathering momentum, it's easy to question why bother.

"We bother because doing so saves lives. We all play a part in this pandemic, and our individual actions add up, and have a wider impact. If we stopped bothering, we would see case rates rising even more so, and consequently more hospitalisations and, tragically, deaths.

"So now, as we're approaching our second Christmas and New Year with coronavirus,



#### **COVID UPDATE**

In line with Public Health England (PHE) instructions we are not required to operate a track and trace system within the school.

#### Main symptoms of Covid-19

A high temperature

A new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours. A loss or change in sense of smell or taste – they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

#### What should you do if your child exhibits ANY symptom?

If they show any of the main symptoms of Covid-19, even if they are mild:-

Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab and not a Lateral Flow Test) to check if they have Covid-19, as soon as possible.

Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result - they can only leave home to have the test.

Public Health England have advised that siblings should also get a PCR test, but unless they are showing symptoms they are allowed to continue to come to school until they receive their result.

Please call the school office by 9.30am advising the reason your child is away from school and let us know once you have received the results.

Mr Roseveare had a great time teaching the class.


