


## The Limitless Lemon Yellows



FOUNDATION

Fully Funded Bursary Programme, Years 7 to 13





West Buckland School Foundation was incorporated in 2003 with the aim of raising funds to provide bursarie and help support the school in delivering high quality education.

Whilst closely aligned and mutually supportive, the School and the Foundation are separate charities

Each year the *Foundation* seeks to *award* up to *two fully-funded bursaries* for entry into Year 7. The award will *support* the pupil from Year 7 to ff and will be reviewed for Sixth Form, should that pupil

wish to stay after GCSEs.

All academic exam costs will be met by the Foundation however, extras such as school uniform, school lunches, school transport, boarding and other costs not included in the school fees are not automatically included in the Bursary award. Further support may be available for extras at the Trustees' discretion.

Eligibility

- Applicants to the Foundation Bursary Fund must fulfil all the following principal criteria:
- Applicants must be day pupils who have been permanent residents within Devon or Somerset for at least 1 year prior to application
- Applicants must currently be in Year 6 and not attending an independent school
- As a guideline, the Foundation will only consider those families whose joint family income is below £38,000 (gross) and whose assets are below £250,000

- Parents/Guardians/Carers are required to send the following information in support of their application:
- A completed Admission Form
- A completed confidential statement of financial circumstances and supporting documentation
- A personal statement from the parent, guardian, carer explaining wh they think the applicant would benefit from a West Buckland education
- A handwritten personal statement from the pupil explaining why they would like to attend West Buckland School
- A copy of the pupil's Year 5 school report
- A reference from someone who knows the pupil in an educational capacity ke: class teacher or coach from external club
