Key Stage One's week:

This week we have worked incredibly hard with our English and have enjoyed looking at 'Augustus and his Smile' and have learned some of the text with actions; see if they can show you! The children have been so inspired by our English we have extended our learning and begun to research and find interesting facts about tigers.
