## Headteacher's message

Dear Parents and Guardians

We have had another busy week in school; on Monday, we had children taking part in junior lifeguard/surfing lessons, our PE Leaders visited Somerset Cricket Grounds in Taunton to watch Somerset -v- Hampshire and today a group of children attended Wimbledon.

We have been trying to keep cool in this hot weather and children have been sensible in wearing hats and applying suncream, when needed. Thank you for encouraging your children to take on additional fluids. They are always welcome to refill their water bottles at school, and we keep a small supply of squash if anyone needs it.

Next Monday, to support data protection, we are using Arbor for the first time to send your child's school report to you. As this is all new to us, please excuse any hiccups or delays in sending. We are looking forward to welcoming you all to parents' evenings next week where we will be discussing your child's progress over the year and which classes they will be going into in September. If you haven't already booked a meeting with your class teacher you can do so using your Arbor parent login.

We have a few staff changes this term; we will be saying goodbye to Mrs Ledger who is moving to another Trust school. Mrs Johnson will be moving to years 5 and 6 with Mr Whapham, joining Miss Williams. Mrs Scott will be moving to Years 3 and 4 and will be joined by Mrs Grimwood and Mr Bayliss. Miss Tillman and Miss Huxtable will be remaining in Years 1 and 2. Mrs Oldfield will continue to teach a Reception/Year 1 class while the Reception class and Nursery will remain the same. After your child has found out which teacher they will be having, we have planned some transitions sessions for them before the end of term.

Finally, the School Council have organised a non-uniform day for Friday 11<sup>th</sup> July. Children are encouraged to wear beach/summer (t-shirts, short, dresses) to reflect our Summer Vibes theme. The School Council will talk to the children about this on Monday.
