### Nursery this week:

This week we have been learning about minibeasts facts. We have been very busy counting all their legs and sorting the ones with 6 legs into the insect category. We have also been reading about 'The bad tempered ladybird' and discussing the importance of being friendly and sharing. We have used the play-dough to give ladybirds 10 spots and had fun playing with our plastic minibeasts in the play tray. We have made ladybird collages and enjoyed colouring all sorts of creatures. Our letter this week is the letter 'i'.

The children have also been busy measuring the different animals using different blocks. The children have done some beautiful writing about the Lion and Mouse in the story as well.

### Key Stage One's week:

We have been continuing to look at position and direction in maths, using language like quarter turn, half turn, right, left, forwards text.

We have enjoyed following a set of instructions for making friendship bracelets, slime or jelly and jam sandwiches after which we wrote our own set of instructions for it.

### Years 3 and 4's week:

The children back at school enjoyed a fun week learning about Italy, designing posters, making pizzas making our own bases in our forest school pizza oven (pepperoni being our favourite topping).

On Tuesday, we didn't let the weather put us off our walk down to Rock Park for some fun and games. Mr Whapham showed us all how not to use the balancing ring, luckily he did not hurt himself. A big thank you to our parent helpers.

We all designed a poster to take part in a joint Premier League/Asda's competition about ocean waste.

### Years 5 and 6 week:

In Mrs Oldfield English group we have been looking at the Dr K Fisher books and letter writing. We received a letter from Tommy the tortoise voicing some worries he has. We researched information on tortoises ready to write our replies.

In year 5 maths, we have focused on fractions, equivalent fractions, improper fractions, how to use fractions in calculations and word problems involving fractions.

We have been avidly studying the woman's world cup and have a class sweep stake going. We are all enjoying supporting the different teams and nationalities. Each morning we updated our spread sheet, discussing the result from the day before and predicting the outcomes for the games being played that day.
