Queries and Complaints

We hope that you will build a good relationship with your child's class teacher and feel able to talk to them if you are unsure of anything, are worried about something or need to clarify something that has happened. Parent Helpers

Legally we are required to obtain a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) check on all adults who work with children.

If you are keen to come and help support us in the classroom then do please visit the School Office and provide them with an email address (which you check regularly) and your full name so that the school can start the online registration process. You will be required to bring in proof of identity after you have completed your side of the online application. There is no cost to parents for this check.

On school trips, in particular, it is much easier for parent helpers to come along as part of a teacher-led activity, so we do hope you will support us in this.

Morning and End of Day Routines

Classrooms are open from 8:30am and children are encouraged to complete a range of morning tasks and activities. Please feel free to stay and settle your child to their task until 8:45 when the register is taken.

Teachers will let you know when it is register time so you can quietly creep away.



The morning can be a busy time for both parents and teachers, so if you need to speak to us, it may be more appropriate to make an appointment after school. Of course, if you have information that needs to be passed on directly, please feel free to talk to us or a teaching assistant.

School ends at 3:10pm and your child will then be sent outside to meet you, once the teacher has seen you. If you think you may be a little late, please phone the office to avoid your child becoming worried.

If you have any changes in your regular collection arrangements please let us know so that we can ensure the safety of the children.

Government Free School Meals

From September 2014 all pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in state funded school in England are entitled to Free School Meals.

Free School Meals - Are you Eligible?

The number of families registered for free school meals makes a real difference to our budget, even if the children do not take up the option of the meal. However, there may be a number of children who could be having a hot meal for free, instead of paying. For every child registered the school will receive Government Pupil Premium monies which we use to help subsidise school trips, residential and enrichment activities.

To QUALIFY for a free meal you need to be in receipt of one of the following:

Healthy Snacks and Drinks

Your child will receive a piece of fruit each day as part of the government 5 A Day Scheme. Children are welcome to bring an additional piece of fruit for the second snack time in the afternoon. We encourage the children to eat a wide range of fruit rather than fruit based snacks wherever possible.

Fruit snacks can be safely stored in the trays and baskets provided in the classrooms.

Children are actively encouraged to have a drink at playtimes, lunchtimes and, when appropriate, during lesson times. They should bring in their drinks bottles, to be kept in the appropriate box in the classroom; water is best for optimum brain activity.

After School Child Care

We offer the provision of after school care for your child from 3.15pm – 6.00pm. If you would like to use this facility there is a daily booking system at the school office. If you would like more information, do ask our office staff or visit:

Positive Behaviour

Here at Orchard Vale we actively promote positive behaviour through rewards and praise. During our weekly assembly, children are nominated to sit on the Happy bench to receive a Head Teacher's award in front of the whole school.

We also support children in their behaviour with a consistent "step" system of sanctions. This system is used across the school and allows children to consider the choices that they make and the consequences of those actions.

Uniform and other belongings

Here at Orchard Vale we are very proud of our school uniform; the children look so smart when they are all wearing it.

Please make sure that your child's uniform is clearly labelled, as you can appreciate one uniform looks very much like another and so when things go missing it can be very hard to track them down.

Drinks bottles, lunch boxes and book bags also need to be clearly labelled as they can also be mislaid or lost.

Your teacher will let you know which days are PE days. Please help your child to remember to bring in their PE kit at the beginning of the week and take it home on a Friday to be washed.

PE kits are always getting mixed up so marking the labels with your child's name will help to stop them getting lost.

Take Ten sports activities will take place on a regular basis to support the PE curriculum. This is a ten minute brain booster during the school day.

Lost property – please ask your child's teacher first if you have lost anything, then look in the lost property area several times as uniform and belongings can appear if named, eventually.

<u>Instrument lessons</u>

If you would like your child to take part in instrument lessons during the school day with a specialist teacher, do ask at the school office for more details.

We can offer tuition on flute, clarinet, keyboard, drums, guitar, violin or recorder.

Home/school communication books

This book needs to come to school with your child in their bag. Every Friday we will add information telling you about your child's progress and letting you know how they are getting on.

At the end of the week there will be an opportunity for you to share some good news or information with us about your child and this will be linked to their assessment.

We love to hear what your children have achieved outside of school and we will share this with the rest of the class.

How to help sheets will come home every term to let you know what is being taught in class and ways you can support your child's learning. If you need help with this do ask for extra ideas from the class teacher who will be pleased to help.

Homework activities

Additional activities may be sent home for your child to work on with your support. Together in school and out of school we can work together to improve your child's progress.

If you have any queries with this work, please talk to your child's teacher. Reading books will be changed every Friday. Please ensure your child's reading book has been returned on Thursday so we can change this on Friday.

Extra-Curricular Clubs

Each term we run several clubs either at dinner time or after school. These change throughout the year, often by pupil request.

Letters and registration forms are circulated at the beginning of each term. If a club is oversubscribed your child will be notified.
