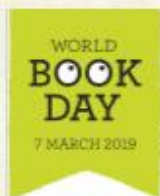

This course is Free if on Means tested benefits that have been approved by the Skills Funding Agency. Such as ESA, JSA or Universal Credit (Mandated) and must be looking for work. All learners must be over 19 in the preceding August Proof of benefits must be brought to first session

A fee of £500 is payable if not on means tested benefits this can be paid in, (£100 at first meeting) instalment and must be paid for in full within 6 weeks of commencement of the course.

A placement is essential for a least 6 hours a week – where you will be observed working and must be in place at the beginning of the course.

Target Audience:

Primarily those working in the Pre-Schools, Out of School sector and those working with young children in play settings, Crèches, in a paid capacity working with children 0 - 5. This award covers people working with youths and those with additional needs – for ages 0 – 18 or 21 with additional needs



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
