Dear Parents/Carers

Finally, we have some wonderful summer weather and have been taking learning outside the classroom as much as possible; during science, geography, phonics sessions and of course forest school.

Our Key Stage One children have thoroughly enjoyed immersing themselves in their Fire of London topic this week. They have created their own Pudding Lane in DT. Mr Quilter acted as the baker where the fire started and Mr Moir was on hand as our fireman. The children were all amazed at how quickly the fire took hold and what was left at the end. As you are all aware, the number of positive Covid cases has been rising across North Devon and we have seen an increase across the school again this week. If your child exhibits any Covid symptoms, please could you still test them with a Lateral Flow Test and let the school office know if the result is a positive one. We appreciate that after 1st April there will be a charge for these test kits. If you are unable to test your child and if they are ill, for whatever reason, they should not be coming into school. As usual we will continue to call parents to collect their child should they be unwell during the school day.

Summer School Uniform

We strongly encouraged children to wear our school uniform and to take pride in looking smart. Our uniform policy has been created to ensure children have the correct attire for learning and are prepared for the expectations beyond their time at Orchard Vale, where the dress code is much stricter.

Covid-19 Update

We are currently seeing a rise in cases of Covid-19 in both pupils and staff across the school, as well as absences due to the normal seasonal ailments.

We will endeavour to maintain continuity of staffing in your child's class as much as possible and to avoid any disruption to their learning journey.

However, there might be occasions when your child will have different staff members working with them. Your help in supporting your child with any change would be greatly appreciated.

Currently, Orchard Vale still need to know if your child exhibits any Covid-19 symptoms and you should keep them at home while they are poorly.

- If your child exhibits Covid symptoms you should take a LFD Test or book a PCR test. (These are free until April but you may have to order one).
- Let the school office know that your child is off school with symptoms and inform us of the results of the LFD or PCR tests when you have them.

• If your child tests positive your child should stay off school.



Day 1 is the day after a positive test.







Day 5 and 6 your child should take a LFD test (24 hours apart);
 If both are negative they can come into school on Day 6.



If the they remain positive your child should stay off school for the full 10 days.
