### Headteacher's message

Dear Parents/Carers

We have had another busy week and the children are continuing to get out and about enjoying fresh autumnal walks, cinema trips, swimming lessons and even a visit to Dartmoor in the sunshine. I am delighted we have been able to provide these much-needed experiences for children and I must say the look of delight on their faces makes it all worthwhile.

Despite our best endeavours to keep Covid at bay we are noticing an increase in illnesses and ensuing absences, across the school in both children and staff. In order to minimise risk, we have reintroduced year group bubbling, this will be reviewed weekly. This will include returning to lunches being eaten in the classroom for some classes, a pause on whole school assemblies and using the zone system in the playground. Due to staffing shortages next week's lunch menu has been altered so please check this on page 4.

This is not intended to alarm anyone, instead, we are just taking some extra precautionary measures in the hope this will help prevent any further spread of coughs, colds, tummy bugs and positive cases of covid.

### COVID UPDATE

As you are all aware cases of Covid-19 are on the rise locally. Orchard Vale have been very fortunate so far during the pandemic but we are now seeing a few cases. Please rest assured that we are continuing with good hygiene measures for everyone, maintaining appropriate cleaning regimes, keeping occupied spaces well ventilated and making use of appropriate PPE.

In line with Public Health England (PHE) instructions we are not required to operate a track and trace system within the school. We are aware other schools in North Devon have received instructions from PHE and are being guided through the correct procedure to communicate cases with parents. At the moment Orchard Vale is not at this stage but we are vigilant and will pass on information should PHE advise us to do so.

#### Symptoms of Covid-19

A high temperature

A new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours.

A loss or change in sense of smell or taste – they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.

#### What should you do if your child exhibits **ANY** symptom?

If they show **any** of the main symptoms of Covid-19, even if they are mild:-

Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab and not a Lateral Flow Test) to check if they have Covid-19, as soon as possible.

Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get the test result – they can only leave home to have the test.

Please call the school office by 9.30am advising the reason your child is away from school and let us know once you have received the results.

## Stone age roundhouse experience



In years 3 and 4, the children had a fantastic time at the Heatree Activity Centre on Dartmoor, learning about the Stone Age and the Bronze Age.

We are running a Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) funded programme at Pilton Infants' School during the Christmas holidays. 
